The Provost's Office has traditionally provided a ½ time administrative and clerical support person for the Retiree Association. Transitions are often unpredictable and may, on occasion, require changes to existing methods. Legislative Committee Report

The Legislative Committee (LC) continues to coordinate the legislative business of the Association, including monitoring and reporting Education Retirement Board

(ERB) and the New Mexico State Government Investment and Pension Operational Committee (IPOC) activities. Representatives from the LC, Fred Rose and Melanie Baise, are attending these meetings to represent the pension benefit interests of UNM retirees and make our presence known. We are also attending other educator retiree association meetings to create alliances around our mutual concerns.

Handout materials are being created to educate our legislators and the community about the importance of making the ERB sustainable and honoring the benefit promises made to current and future retirees working in higher education and K-12. As the state flagship university with four branch campuses, everyone knows someone employed by UNM.

The committee meets every other month on a Wednesday. We met August 31 and October 19. Future meetings dates for 2016 and 2017 are December 7, February 15, April 19, June 21, July 19, and August 16 at 2:30 PM. We currently meet at the UNM Student Success Center, South Campus, 1155 University Blvd., SE. This meeting location may be subject to change as we transition into the future role of the UNM Retiree Association.
